## Learning to Shine



- We are all really looking forward to welcoming all our children's families to the school next week where we can all celebrate the **school's Centenary**. The children, staff and many parents have been working very hard to ensure it's a week for everyone to remember. Many thanks for everyone's hard work, preparing for this exciting event!
- Details regarding the Centenary week:

*Monday 5<sup>th</sup> February – **Back to 1924 day**.* Children can dress up as if they were back in 1924.

*Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> February (2.00pm) – KS2 building open to **Nursery, Reception and Year 1 Parents / Carers and families**.*

*Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> February (2.00pm) – KS2 building open to **Year 2, 3 and 4 Parents / Carers and families**. School will remain open on this day and will be open to the public from 3.15pm until 5pm.*

*Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> February (2.00pm) – KS2 building open to **Year 5 and 6 Parents / Carers and families**.*

*Friday 9<sup>th</sup> February – **Celebration Day for the children**. They can wear party clothes for this special celebratory day!*

Please note that all children will remain in their classes until the end of the day. They will not be able to leave early on any of these days.

- Next Monday (**back to 1924 day**), when the KS2 children come to school at 8.55am, they will need to line up in a straight line in their classes. The teachers will be on the yard at 8.55am to help with this. The 1924 version of Mr Thomas will then enter the yard and tell the children what the '1924' rules are for the day. There will undoubtedly be a little bit of drama and the children will sing the Twyn School song before entering the building. Please make sure the children are in the school yard for 8.55am and please stay if you want to have a bit of a laugh! Breakfast Club will still be on.
- There will be **no afterschool clubs** on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> February. There will also be no Hockey Club on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> February.
- Due to the Centenary work and preparation this half term, we will be moving our **Eisteddfod** celebrations and competitions on a week. The children will still be able to wear traditional costume or red sports tops into school on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March and again, will be able to wear them on Friday 8<sup>th</sup> March as we celebrate the Eisteddfod in school.
- The **INSET days** have been allocated. There will be NO SCHOOL for pupils on the following days: Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February 2024, Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2024 and Monday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2024 (May Bank Holiday).
